Ephesians 3:20-21

This week we studied one of Paul's doxologies found in Ephesians 3:20-21 and learned about the character of our great God. When we truly understand our God, we learn that He is genuinely awesome! It's imperative for us as believers to truly understand our God in order to hunger in our pursuit of Him. The more that we learn from the revelation of God's Word the more we will grow to love and trust our God. Questions

1. What does it mean that our God is capable? How able is our God? What is too difficult for Him? What have been some of the impossible things our God has already accomplished? Describe God's resume of capability?

2. When God says that He is able how should that ignite your faith? What are some ways that you need to begin to trust God's ability in your life? What keeps you from being dependent upon God in those areas? What difference might it make if you were to trust the Lord completely?
3. What does it mean that we serve an abundant God? How is our God generous? What has He lavished on you? How is the Gospel an example of God's abundance?
4. What is the prayer of Jabez in 1 Chronicles 4:9-10? What are four areas Jabez's prayer asks of God? Why does he want abundance? Why does he want influence? Why does he want God's presence? Why does he want God's protection? How does God respond to his request? Why?
5. What may be an area that you are impoverished because you are refusing to ask the Lord for help? How would the Lord answering that prayer be helpful in the lives of others? What keeps you from asking for God's help?
6. How powerful is our God? What are some powerful things that Scripture records our God doing? What is the significance to that God dwelling inside of you?
7. Where is the power of God located? How does the enemy lie to you and keep you from believing that God's power rests in you? What difference would it make to believe that God's power wants to be unleashed in your life? Where could you use a little more of God's power?
8. What does it mean that our God is glorious? Why is our God worthy? How should our God be worshipped? What gets in your way of worshipping God?
9. Where is God's glory put on display? How is God's glory put on display in Christ through the gospel? How is God's glory put on display in the church? Why in the church? How primary is the church in the life of a believer?
10. What does it mean that God is eternal? How significant is our response to God in this life? How does God want to deal with our sin? Is there any sin you are dealing with that you haven't confessed and repented from? Why?
11. What has been most impactful about this teaching to you? What specific applications is the Lord calling you to make?
