

**Put an end to your life of sin (5-7)**

Identity must precede behavior; your position is as victor, you are forgiven.

We are not given new bodies at salvation; the same flesh we had as non-Christians still has a desire to sin.

We are to put to death; to kill it! We are to be ruthless in what must be cut off.

**Practice living righteous in your relationships (8-10a)**

Why would you want to put on grave clothes? After you shower, you don't put your dirty clothes back on again.

We're all dysfunctional in some way; if you don't see it, that's just how dysfunctional you are!

We put on clean clothes when we get out of the shower. We're washed by Christ, let Him redress us.

**Progress in your maturity with Christ (10b-11)**

The new has come! Work this out... what you can become is what you want to be

View yourself as a victor – more than a conqueror; that's who you are. As you believe it you will begin to live it out!

It doesn't matter what your national, ethical, cultural, social, economic, or political distinctions are. There is no distinction.
