

## **Sermon Questions**

### **Luke 9:46-10:16**

This week we discussed that once we are saved that we are disciples of Christ who are called to grow into His likeness. The reality is that Jesus wants YOU! God the Father demonstrated His love to the world by sending His only begotten so that whoever believed would not perish but have Eternal Life. Jesus Christ paid the penalty for all the sins of humanity on the cross for everyone who believes. This free gift is received by grace through faith. However, once you become a believer, Jesus Christ demands full allegiance to Him and His mission on planet earth. This week we discussed four actions that Jesus wants every one of His followers to take. Although the call can be demanding, it also provides the greatest joy and peace for those who follow Him. May the Holy Spirit guide and convict you so that you may become all that God has purposed for you to become.

### **Questions**

1. How does Jesus respond to the man who tells Him that he will follow Jesus wherever He goes? What is significant about the response of Jesus? How do the foxes and the birds have it better than Jesus? What was Jesus asking this man to consider? Why should we all count the cost of discipleship? What areas of your life cater more towards comfort and security than discipleship?

2. When Jesus called the second man to follow Him what was his problem? Why is “Me First” the antithesis of Jesus Christ being Lord? Why should Christians focus their time on what non-believers can’t do? Why should we follow a path that brings the greatest result for the kingdom of Jesus Christ? Why is the proclamation of the kingdom such an imperative? How can you focus your life more on sharing the hope of Jesus Christ?
3. What was the challenge of the third guy in the story who told Jesus he would follow Him but first wanted to go say good-bye to his family? Why is the Gospel message so urgent? Why is our call to follow Christ even more important than our family? Why must we continue forward and not turn back? What needs to change in your life to give Christ full allegiance?
4. Why does Jesus Christ want our full allegiance as disciples? What are some hinderances in your life that keep Jesus from being Lord? What area of your life would Jesus say, “Why do you call me Lord, Lord and do not do what I say?” What changes do you need to make right now?
5. How plentiful is the harvest Jesus is addressing? Out of the nearly 8 billion people in our world how many would you guess are unsaved? Knowing that we are God’s plan for seeing people saved how much more intentional do you need to become? Who can you be sharing the Gospel with in your sphere of influence? How can you become more engage in Gospel ministry?
6. Why are we called to pray for more ministry partners? Why does God need more disciples that are fully engaged with Him? Why must we be engaged in the battle in order to pray for more workers? How engaged are you? Where is God calling you to serve in this season?
7. Why does Jesus tell us to go? Why does Christ want everyone on mission? What is the Great Commission? Why is God concerned with nations? Why is He concerned with cities? How we called in our nation and city to serve the Lord? How can we be more intentional as a church for advancing Christ’s kingdom with the Gospel?
8. How can we be more dependent with our prayers? How can we trust God more for our provision? For our peace? For our protection? For our production?
9. How is God glorified when we bear much fruit? How is prayer and the fruit we produce linked? Who is the One who produces fruit in our lives? How can you be more dependent upon Christ to produce fruit?
10. Who gives us the authority to act and speak? Why should we rely on Christ’s authority? What does Christ have authority to do? Does Christ still heal? Does Christ still deliver from demons? Does Christ still use the proclamation of His Word?

11. When you are true to the Word and people listen who are they truly listening to?  
When you are true to the Word and people reject you who are they truly rejecting?
12. Why should we be more intentional in sharing the Gospel? Do you really believe in heaven and hell? Do you really believe that lost people go to hell? Then how should you live and what should you say?
13. What was most impactful truth for you from this week's message? What is God asking you to stop doing, start doing or start doing differently? Will you by faith do what He is showing you?
