The Gospel ...

Results from God's mercy and provides boldness. (1)

Demands personal and Scriptural integrity. (2)

Proves true and glorious even if people reject it. (3-4)

Declares that Jesus Christ is Lord and we are His slaves. (5)

Necessitates worshipping Jesus Christ. (6)

Questions for Discussion:

When and how did you personally come to understand God's mercy and come to faith in Christ?

Do you know unbelievers who, having heard the gospel of Christ, rejected it? If so, who? Why do you think they rejected it?

What are some ways people tamper with the gospel message to make it more palatable to unbelievers? Why should such "ways" be renounced?

What does it look like to "lose heart" when seeking to minister the gospel to unbelievers?

What can help us be bolder in sharing Christ with unbelievers?

Who are some unbelievers you could invite to our Easter Sunday worship services? Take time in your meeting to pray for these people together.
