

Sermon Questions

Exodus 24:1-25:9

This week we discussed what God calls a man to be and to do. So many men in our culture are confused and have a difficult time understanding what they need to be doing. Regardless of vocation, a man is designed by God to serve God. As we have studied the life of Moses we have seen how he was God's chosen instrument by design and what the Lord was requiring of him. Through a study of his life we learn valuable lessons about calling and how the Lord wants us to respond to Him. This week's message highlighted four activities that men are called to engage if they are going to be the fullness of Jesus Christ. May the teaching of His Word grow and bless you.

Here are some notes to review from this week's sermon...

The Calling of a Man

Exodus 24:1-25:9

God calls a man to...

Hear His voice and communicate His Word (1-4a)

Champion the atonement and lead in worship (24:4b-8)

Prioritize His presence and delegate responsibilities (24:9-18)

Compel generosity in others and steward resources His way (25:1-9)

Questions

1. Why does a man of God need to hear God's voice? How does God speak today? If the Word is the inerrant and authoritative instruction for us, then how should we approach our times of reading, preaching, teaching, memorizing, meditating, etc.? Does God still use other methods of communication to speak to us? What might some of these be?
2. In order to hear the voice of the Lord what must we be willing to do? Why is seeking the face of the Lord so important? Without hearing God's voice, how can one follow God? Regardless of vocation why must a man know what God is saying?

3. Why does God choose a man and not a group? What is significant about this truth? What does this teach us about our calling? What are the two types of calling a man may have? If a man has a calling to start and lead something what must he do? If a man has a calling to follow the God-given vision of another man what must he do?
4. Why is communicating what the Lord is sharing so important? Why are men afraid to share what they are hearing from the Lord? Why are men afraid to lead? Why is it important to share what you are hearing from the Lord? What happens when men do not share what the Lord is sharing with them?
5. Why should you not complain that someone's vision is too small and doesn't include you? What are three godly choices you can make if you don't like following a leader? Why is serving graciously and honoring a leader (even when you don't agree) a good thing? Why is finding someone else to follow such a good thing? Why is starting your own thing a good choice?
6. Why is remaining frustrated under a vision a bad idea for you and the people within the organization? Why should you not remain and gossip? Rally people to your way of thinking? Complain? Grumble? Or sow seeds of discord? How does satan use these behaviors to cause faction, division and pain? Why do you not want to be satan's pawn?
7. What has God been speaking to you? What is God sharing with you? Who do you need to tell?
8. What does it mean to champion the atonement? How can you know if someone is truly grateful for the gospel in their life? Why must men be saturated and thankful for the blood of Christ?
9. What does it mean to lead people in your sphere of influence into worship? How can you lead people in worship if you are not a pastor? How can you lead your family in worship if you are not a pastor?
10. What does it mean to prioritize God's presence? How often should we be seeking the Lord? Why is spending time alone with God such a valuable asset for a man of God? What is the challenge when men don't spend time with the Lord? What are men doing that makes them too busy to seek the Lord?
11. Why must men delegate responsibilities of their calling? Why is a plurality of leadership essential? What is the problem when men cannot delegate responsibilities? Did Jesus delegate responsibilities? What is the Great Commission all about?
12. Why are men called to compel generosity in others? Why would God want His people to be generous? Does God need money? What is God looking for? Since your

money is connected to your heart, why would God want your generosity to go towards Him?

13. Is it possible to outgive God? Is God able to continue to provide even when you are extremely generous? How is God calling you to be even more generous than you are currently?
14. What has been your greatest take-a-way from this week's message? What is God calling you to apply to your life right now?
