Arrogant experts make it their job to <u>judge other's motives</u>, but humble servants focus on <u>serving</u> and leave <u>all judgment</u> to the LORD. (1-5)

Arrogant experts <u>consider themselves</u> more spiritual than others, but humble servants <u>recognize everything</u> they possess is a gift from God. (6-7)

Arrogant experts <u>avoid pain</u> and <u>snub</u> those who suffer, but humble servants <u>willingly suffer</u> for the sake of others and <u>patiently endure</u> for the sake of Christ. (8-13)
