The Gospel invites you to ... Die to self, die to sin and die with Christ. Live by <u>faith in Christ</u>. Lavish in **His grace**. Questions for Discussion: What did Paul mean when he wrote "I have been crucified with Christ?" When did that happen? How did that happen? Who crucified him? When Paul wrote "...it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me:" What changed in Paul's life? What didn't change? What does it mean to "live by faith in Christ?" How is it similar to our initial faith in Christ for salvation? How is *living* by faith in Christ different than seeking righteousness "through the law?" What does it look like for someone to seek righteousness through the law? What was the purpose for Christ's dying? What is "the grace of God?" What could "nullify" God's grace? What keeps Christians from lavishing in God's grace? Are you lavishing personally in God's grace? If not, why not?
